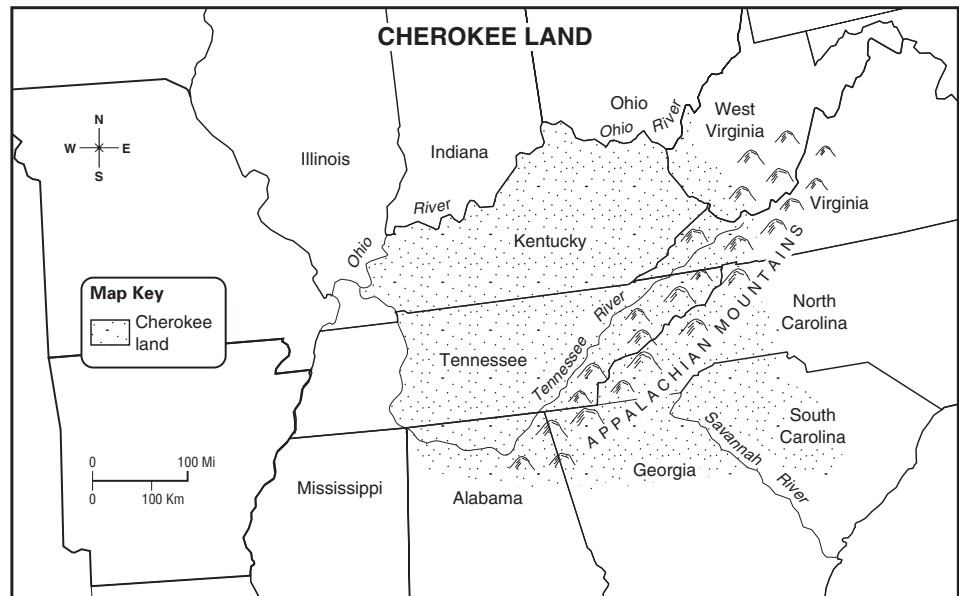


Rivers
